## Additional ACPE Information

### Educational Objectives:

At the completion of this program, the participant should be able to:

1. Discuss the intersection of Illinois public health regulations and private sector health care provider compliance.
2. Explain the latest Illinois legislative agenda include the state of current health care bills being contemplated in Springfield, Illinois.
3. Describe telemedicine modalities, the impact of licensure, and the current Illinois law addressing telemedicine.
4. Discuss the national cannabis movement including gaining an understanding of the current Illinois law relating to cannabis.

8. Describe the regulatory and liability issues affecting medical director agreements.
9. Discuss the business of insurance and how private sector health care providers are protected.
10. Describe wealth transfer and succession planning related to their health care business and personal assets.

### Continuing Pharmacy Education Requirements

This activity is structured to meet knowledge-based educational needs and acquire factual knowledge. Information in knowledge-type activities is based on evidence as accepted in the literature by the health care professions. Continuing pharmacy education (CPE) credit will be earned based on participation in the activity. Attendance and participation are required before obtaining CPE credit. Any individual who is more than 10 minutes late to an activity or leaves an activity early will not be granted CPE credit. This procedure will be strictly enforced, so please plan accordingly. Participants must complete an activity evaluation and posttest (if applicable) with a passing score of 70 percent or greater.

This activity is accredited through ACPE for pharmacist continuing pharmacy education credit.

If all requirements are met, participants will receive continuing pharmacy education credit in the following manner. Partial credit will not be awarded. Please allow 60 days for processing.

### **Pharmacists**

CPE Monitor, a national, collaborative effort by ACPE and the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) to provide an electronic system for pharmacists and technicians to track their completed CPE credits, went into effect on January 1, 2013. IPhA, as an ACPE-accredited provider, is required to report pharmacist CPE credit using this tracking system. Pharmacist participants must provide their NABP e-Profile Identification Number and date of birth (in MMDD format) when they register for a CPE activity or complete activity evaluations. It will be the responsibility of the pharmacist to provide the correct information (IE e-Profile Identification Number and Date of birth in MMDD Format. If this information is not provided, NABP and ACPE prohibit IPhA from issuing CPE Credit. Online access to their inventory of completed credits will allow pharmacists to easily monitor their compliance with CPE requirements and print statements of credit. Therefore, IPhA will not provide individual printed statements of credit to pharmacists.
